Basic Needs Ministry is the home of Cleveland Township Emergency Food Pantry, which is a Partner Agency with the Food Bank of Central and Eastern North Carolina and an Affiliate of the Inter-Faith Food Shuttle. To feed the 1,200 residents who go hungry during a typical year in Cleveland Township, the pantry is providing over 2,000 pounds of food per week or \$300,000 worth per year.

*Basic Needs provides free food and clothing to those in economic need at the direction of 300 churches, schools and government agencies. Locally, this targets more than 7,200 children receiving free and reduced public school lunches; 8,000 households living on less than \$25,000 in annual income; and disaster victims.*



Basic Needs Ministry has the largest display of free and low cost clothing displayed by category and size in the Wake/Johnston area. Over 800 major labels appear on the 28,000 garments. Over 200,000 items of clothing are sorted by volunteers and displayed by category and size each year.



Over 125,000 residents of Wake and Johnston counties have no medical insurance and another 125,000 are underinsured and pay full price for some of their prescription drugs. Basic Needs is providing drug discount cards to save residents 10-40% on their prescriptions. Our emergency drug team will solicit donations of high cost drugs for our low income residents.



Cleveland residents attending Wake and Johnston Tech, who do not have home computers or Internet access are having trouble completing their courses. Local school students are at a disadvantage without after school computer access. Microsoft, GCF, and Triangle United Way provided computers and basic software to set up the area's first public access free computer training program at Basic Needs.
